Business Spotlight: Hargrave Mums and More

The Hargraves just aren't 40-hour work week type of people.

Kenny and his wife, Teresa, are each letter carriers for the U.S. Postal Service in Carmi. Their daughter, 20-year-old Chelsea, works for the post office in Grayville and is finishing up her college degree.

Eighteen-year-old son Chance is a senior at Carmi-White County High School who plans to study ag production and ag management this fall at Wabash Valley College in Mt. Carmel.

All four also help run the family business: Hargrave Mums and More, located at 405 Plum Street in Carmi.

"I was raised on a farm, so I've always worked my whole life," said Kenny. "Teresa has too and that's how we raised our kids. We don't mind working."

The business started in 2000 just after the Hargraves had gotten out of the cattle business. Teresa's uncle and aunt, Bob and Barbara Naas from Omaha, had a greenhouse and gave the young couple advice to start their business, which initially consisted of just sales of mums. That business grew steadily for 10 years at the Hargrave farm before Kenny and Teresa bought out another business to expand their inventory and moved to their former location on Route 14 at the edge of town.

"So now we had trees, shrubs, annuals, perennials, mulch, and some landscaping supplies," said Kenny. "And now, we also do some landscaping jobs, as well."

Last year, the business relocated to its current Plum Street location.

"This location is much, much better for us," said Kenny.

It is open from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday, and from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturday. The business' phone number is 618-384-9153 and Hargrave Mums and More also has its own Facebook page. (Continued on page 2...)

“It really started as a way to give me something to do,” said Kenny of the origin of the business. “I had grown up on a farm and we always had hogs or cattle my whole life, so we always had something to do. The kids were 2 and 4 when we started, and those kids were out there filling up pots and packing them around with us, too. They’ve done it pretty much their whole life. Without the kids, we wouldn’t be able to get it all done.”

Hargrave Mums and More has two other employees, Chelsea Dolden and Haven Kirkpatrick, as well.

“At my other job, I meet a lot of people and talk a lot,” said Kenny. “I enjoy working with people and showing them what I think would look good. A happy customer is the greatest thing for me to see.”

The Hargrave name has a steep tradition in Carmi and Kenny is a prime example.

“I’ve never lived anywhere else; I’ve never had any desire to live anywhere else,” he said. “I don’t think I’ve ever been out of White County for more than a week at a time in my life.”

Among the notable Hargraves in the city’s history were Willis Hargrave, who was a member of the committee to draft the Illinois Constitution, and George B. Hargrave, who was elected sheriff of White County in 1824, when he was just 27 years old.

Kenny also has strong ties to another Carmi tradition: Two Tony’s Restaurant.

“I attribute a lot of my success in business to Ted and Ruth Ann Smith,” he said. “I started to work for them at the old Two Tony’s Restaurant when I was 13 years old. When I was 15, Mike Malone, who had been the assistant manager, left and Ted came up to me and told me they’d like for me to be the assistant manager. I said ‘OK’ so they showed me what I needed to do to take of the place when they were gone.

“One night, Ted came in from outside after closing time and said, ‘Hey Kenny, your mom’s outside waiting on you.’ I said, ‘Yeah, I know.’ ‘Is your car broke down or something?’ I said, ‘Ted, I’m only 15 years old. I can’t drive yet.’”

\$10 Wellness Profile – Glucose and good/bad breakdown of cholesterol, and GFR – these are all included in \$50 Health Screen Profile

\$2 Blood Typing – Identifies blood type; includes a card with blood type listed. Can be added to any of the tests.

For most accurate results, participants should be “fasting” – no food or drink, except water, after midnight before blood draw. Results will be provided to participant’s designated provider.

Winter and Conner Preview Baseball and Softball for Kiwanis

Since 2003, Carmi White County baseball and softball has enjoyed unprecedented success. Both sports' all time winningest coaches remain at the helm for their 14th seasons this year. Baseball Coach Craig Winter and Softball Coach Scott Conner honored the past and previewed their upcoming schedules for the Carmi Kiwanis Club Thursday.

Coach Winter talked about his pride and passion, not only in his baseball program, but in the history of the program and Carmi's community, athletics and academics in general. Carmi baseball began in 1951 and didn't begin to play more than 10 games per season until around 1970, making the all time win count of 681 all the more impressive. Bulldog baseball teams have won 25 regionals, 6 sectionals and appeared in 5 state tournaments. For comparison purposes, the only southern Illinois team with more regional titles is Harrisburg with 27. Only Teutopolis and DuQuoin with 14, Harrisburg with 9, and Eldorado with 6 have more sectional championships. Before Winter became the 11th baseball coach in CWC history, the Bulldogs were coached by quite a line of impressive instructors, among them Ken Hurt, John McDougal, John Evers, Jessie Newton, Carl Justice, Tom Mears, Don Garrett, Brad Lee and Jim Thompson.

The 2016 baseball team is coming off back to back regional championships. The team will feature 7 seniors, 2 juniors and several quality sophomores Winter thinks will compete for playing time. He looks to win a conference championship, a third straight regional and wants to make a deep run into the postseason, but says he guarantees his team will take it one pitch at a time.

As impressive as Winter's baseball accomplishments, Coach Scott Conner's softball spoils are maybe even more dominating. Conner is being assisted this season by Cindy Coleman and Chris Lucas and is excited to have his team playing on the new Archie Brown Memorial Field. Hand in hand with the new field, Conner also praised the Big Mister Practice HQ for assisting the girls in practicing their softball swings and especially their mechanics.

Carmi White County Lady Bulldog softball will feature 14 players and 3 seniors including Kaylea Chappelle who's already committed to play college softball at St. Louis University. The team has only lost 2 seniors from a regional winning team and expectations are high once again.

Conner elaborated on how proud he was that CWC has been able to build a program that gives girls the opportunity to not only be successful here, but potentially get college paid for through scholarships. Currently, former Bulldog softball players competing at college include Bailey Winters at Wabash Valley, Kelsey Rogers at John A. Logan, Jerrica Money at Rend Lake, Alexa Combs is at UT-Martin. In addition to Chappelle's commitment to SLU, junior Morgan Combs has already verbally committed to UT-Martin.

Both coaches expect Johnston City to be their biggest competition for conference championships this year. Both teams kick off their seasons on March 19th. Jason Craig will be anchoring coverage of Carmi White County baseball and softball on 97.3 WRUL and online this year. The schedule and games set for broadcast will be listed on the sports page of WRUL.com prior to the season's start.

Golfers and Sponsors needed for Chamber golf tournament; Money to benefit CWC Students

The Carmi Chamber of Commerce will host their annual Golf Tournament Saturday, June 25 at the Carmi Country Club. Golfers are needed for both the 8 a.m. and 1 p.m. shotgun start.

The “best-ball” tournament format features four-person teams at a cost of \$50 per member, which includes all green fees, cart fees and lunch. Each member of the winning team will receive a \$100 gift certificate to the country club and a commemorative tournament golf shirt.

Members of the second place team will each received \$50 country club gift certificates, and third place team members will receive \$25 gift certificates.

Prizes will also be awarded for the longest drive, longest putt and closest to the pin contests.

“A \$10,000 cash prize will be awarded to any golfer fortunate enough to hit a hole-in-one on one of the designated holes that day,” said golf tournament Education Committee Chairman Bryan Cowling

“The money raised will be used to continue the Chamber’s scholarship program, continue competitive classroom grants for Carmi White County teachers and toward investing in the White County CEO Program. Chamber scholarship winners receive a \$4,000 scholarship paid at \$1,000 each year for the first four years of college,” Cowling noted.

Lunch will be provided for all golfers and sponsors from noon to 1 p.m. Individuals that would like to attend, but do not to play golf, may purchase lunch for \$10.

One may register by calling the Chamber office at 382-7606 or by stopping at the office located in the City Building on West Main Street. Deadline for golf registrations is Friday, June 17.

Sponsorships of various levels are also available to fund the event, beginning at \$100. Those interested in a sponsorship could contact the Chamber office no later than May 26.
